OBJECTIVES:

- giving value to the rights of the assisted victims, through a process that allows them to take informed decisions regarding their options;
- maximising the organisational resources in offering education and support services, with the purpose to empower the victims and survivors of human trafficking or domestic violence;
- sustaining the professionals and the community working in this field in supporting victims and survivors.



STRATEGIC PRIORITIES 2011-2012:

- 1. Strengthening support services for beneficiaries
 - sustaining an effective process of healing the traumas of domestic violence or human trafficking
 - increasing the capacity of the beneficiaries to maintain healthy relationships
- 2. Increasing the access to services and advocacy activity (rehabilitation services and case management)
- 3. Increasing the organisational capacity (infrastructure and development)
- 4. Commitment to excellence in services (evaluation and quality assurance)

ACTIVITIES:

1. Awareness and education campaigns, in communities

Purpose: increasing the public commitment, with the purpose of supporting a future society with no tolerance for domestic violence

- informing materials for raising awareness on domestic violence and human trafficking
- educational activities
- assistance and collaboration partnerships

Example: SHOUT IT OUT campaign for involving the community in ending violence on victims from their proximity

Beneficiaries: 480 students, 15 teachers, 2 partner organisations

2. Internal training and media implication

- training and equipping the Solwodi team
- Solwodi reference point between victims and destination countries (9 victims)
- collaborations for making a documentary film on victims (ex.: Mantra Film, ARD)

3. The rehabilitation programme of the Centres for counselling and recovery for victims and their children

- intervention in crisis situations
- individual and group counselling for victims healing, empowerment, security, crisis recovery, developing life objectives, creating a support network
- individual and group counselling of children, educational and recreational activities
- holistic assistance programme medical assistance, mental health and drogues abuse, children care and support services for children, psychological counselling, professional guidance, juridical assistance

Services are independent of victims' financial possibilities.
